People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant: Let us pray

It is right to praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life, who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.* 

Celebrant: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

People: Hosanna in the highest.

# April 14, 2019 Isaiah 50:4-9a, Psalm 31:9-16, Philippians 2:11, Luke 22:14—23:56

## **OUR TIMES ARE IN GOD'S HANDS**

Take time to read Luke's passion gospel, Lk.22:14—23:56, in all its painful, agonizing detail, from the Passover meal through Jesus' burial and the women's sabbath rest. Imagine you are there witnessing the story as it happens; let yourself feel the emotions that rise up from your heart as each scene plays out before you. Join the women in resting as the passage closes.

Take a few deep, cleansing breaths and turn to the psalm appointed for today, Ps.31:9-16. Read it in the light of the gospel you have just experienced. Hear the words coming from Jesus himself as he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane on the Mount of Olives. Imagine his despondency as he recognizes he feels "as useless as a broken pot." But still he testifies, "I have trusted in you, O Lord, . . . you are my God. My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies . . . in your loving kindness save me." There



he is crying out just as we do in our distress here and now. Our gospel proclaims self-giving showing love forth at the end of his prayer as he says, "yet not my will but yours be done." What an affirmation of Jesus' absolute trust in the Lord! And what an example for us as to how to accept what is right

before us in the circumstances of our lives.

Our times are in God's hands who is at work in us, transforming us into the *imago dei* we were created to be.
