Stripping of the altar Altar Guild members

Please depart in silence after the stripping of the altar.

Maundy, a Latin verb usually translated “commandment,” is taken from John’s account of this Thursday night. As Jesus and the disciples were eating their final meal together before Jesus’ arrest, He washed the disciples’ feet to illustrate humility and the spirit of servant hood. Luke gives an account of Jesus telling the disciples to take the bread and wine in remembrance of His Body and Blood.

After the meal, as Jesus and the disciples walked toward Gethsemane, Jesus taught His disciples a “new” commandment that was not really new (John 13: 34-35):

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, you also ought to love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.
