Together we have succeeded in raising \$25,000 for The Children's Learning Center at the luncheon held at Holy Family on Dec. 12, 3017. It is with great appreciation that we send thanks for your contribution of \$100. With your gift, you confirm your recognition of the critical importance of Franklin County providing a facility for safe childcare and early education for our youngest children.

We estimate that a "bare bones" renovation of Wing A of the Johnson Complex in Apalachicola for the Children's Learning Center will cost \$250,000. We now have funds to support a very beginning effort with the commitment of our project manager, Creighton Brown, and his team of volunteers.
